The PLAN Jeffco Stewardship Academy exists to:

- Promote PLAN Jeffco among county and metro-area residents
- Promote active stewardship of open space parks and other natural areas
- Broaden participants' perspective, appreciation, and stewardship awareness of open lands
- Encourage dialog and mutual understanding among community members and stewardship professionals
- Elicit new ideas for land stewardship from the community
- Provide participants with tools to act as advocates for land stewardship within their communities

- List actions they can take to ensure open lands remain sustainable, safe, and available to all visitors and
- List actions they can take to ensure open lands provide sustainable and safe habitat for native flora and fauna
