
What's been happening at the Open Space Advisory Committee (OSAC) meetings...

Regular Open Space Advisory Committee meetings are generally held on the first Thursday of every other month, starting at 6:00 PM. <u>https://www.jeffco.us/1581/Advisory-Committee</u>

January 11, 2024: Approved acquisition of 167 acre Tibaldo property in partnership with Denver Mountain Parks for \$3M. Property is located off highway 74, connecting Elk Meadow (JCOS), Bergen Peak and Mt. Pence (DMP), Bergen Peak State Wildlife Area, and Arapaho National Forest. \$1.25 M each DMP and JCOS. and hopefully a grant from GOCO. Demolition and cleanup of structures is estimated at \$1 million. Discussed Apex & Hall property in Executive Session.

Moon Place, Moffit & Routt Counties

Comprising 5,813 acres, the Moon Place property is owned by the Tuttle family and serves as seasonal grazing ground. The Tuttle family is a 7th generation sheep ranching family that manages land spread throughout the lower Yampa River Valley. The family has a strong conservation ethic, having conserved over 23,000 acres of land in total. The Moon Place property is located in both Moffat and Routt Counties, about 8 miles southeast of Craig and 6 miles southwest of Hayden. The property lies within the Williams Fork Mountains and is within the Yampa River watershed.

The Moon Place property consists of sagebrush shrublands and shrub steppe, Gambel oak mixed mountain shrublands, aspen stands, numerous ponds and springs, cliffs and rock outcrops. Habitat is provided for Columbian sharp-tailed grouse, ferruginous hawk, Greater sage-grouse, Greater sandhill crane, northern leopard frog, black bear, elk, moose, mountain lion, mule deer and pronghorn. Elk and mule deer use the property as part of a larger migration corridor. Project partners include Natural Resources Conservation Service and Routt County Purchase Development Rights.

Home Place, Routt County

Located in western Routt County about 7 miles southeast of Craig and 6 miles southwest of Hayden, the 810-acre Home Place property is owned by the Barnes family, which manages the property for cattle grazing. Part of a land patent from the State of Colorado in 1964, the property was acquired by the Barnes family in 1974. The family has been ranching cattle for four generations.

The Home Place property consists of sagebrush shrublands and shrubsteppe, mixed mountain shrublands, grass pastures and swales. Habitat is provided for bald eagle, Columbian sharp-tailed grouse (including 2 active leks), ferruginous hawk, Greater sage-grouse, Greater sandhill crane, northern leopard frog, black bear, elk, moose, mule deer and pronghorn. The property is part of a winter concentration area for elk and provides important winter habitat during the most severe winters. Project partners include Natural Resources Conservation Service and Routt County Purchase Development Rights.

Wonderhaven in Boulder Permanently Protected

Mountain Area Land Trust (MALT) is pleased to announce the closing of a voluntary Conservation Easement on a unique property in a densely populated community within the Rural North Boulder neighborhood in the City of Boulder. The owners, Tim and Kerry Francis, founded Wonderhaven in 2014[,] establishing a half-acre garden on their 5-acre parcel. Over the last 9 years, they have grown the garden into a center of social connection for the community. The property is known by many locals as Dharma's Garden. Dharma was the name given to a baby deer born on the land in 2011, to the wonderment of the kindergarten students next door and is a constant reminder of the beauty of the meadow grasses around the garden.

The partnership has resulted in the development of collaborative youth programs, Tribal land restoration support, and the Traditional Harvest Project, which seeks to restore cultural access to ancestral lands through partnership with private landowners.


