Quarry Fire at Deer Creek Canyon Park. On Tuesday, July 30 around 10 p.m., a fire started in Deer Creek Canyon Park, next to Deer Creek Canyon Road south of the old quarry. By Wednesday morning, South Valley Park and Hildebrand Ranch Park were also closed for active fire operations in what became the Quarry Fire. Reynolds Park was closed on Thursday, August 1 because portions of the park were located in the pre-evacuation zone. The Jeffco Open Space Wildland Fire Team (OSWFT) was activated immediately and was a vital part of the operations throughout the week. JCOS activated the volunteer Fire Awareness Team (FAT) to help staff closures and provide visitor safety and resource protection stewardship education contacts. As of this writing, all parks except for Deer Creek have been reopened.

Colorado Day Volunteer Event. Colorado became the 38th State of the Union on August 1st, 1876 – hence the nickname, the Centennial State. On August 3rd of this year, JCOS mounted a volunteer and team effort for trail maintenance on North Table Mountain Park, Rimrock Trail.

Mountain Bike Courtesy Efforts. JCOS Visitor Services Park Permit team, Rangers and high school coaches have implemented a trail and safety orientation for student athletes for the 2024 season. The purpose of the program is to instill in these young riders the concept of safety and courtesy towards all park visitors. Those who have completed the orientation can be identified by a light blue, credit-card-sized card attached to their bikes.

Data Blitz. July 27th was the day that 39 volunteers (including yours truly), stationed at 13 different park entry locations, counted numbers and types of visitors to better understand park visitation and recreation choices.

Heritage Stewardship Team Field Trip. The JCOS Heritage Stewardship team joined with Denver Mountain Parks and Boulder's Open Space & Mountain Parks staff to visit the recently closed Echo Lake Lodge & Summit Lake Park. JCOS will be partnering with DMP and City of Fort Collins at this year's COSA conference for a panel session discussing Integrated Resource Management: Balancing the Protection of Heritage and Natural Resources.

ENOR summer camp is a wrap. The 2024 ENOR summer camp was a success. Four weeks of camp, 236 campers on week-long adventures, exploring and learning about local open space and state parks.

Fire Ecology and Landscaping. Join the community class on August 20 from 6:00-7:30 p.m. to learn about fire ecology and landscaping to safeguard against wildfires. Jeffco Open Space Construction Updates


Windy Saddle Park, Mount Zion Trail. Construction of the Mount Zion Trail is complete. This steep and previously highly eroded trail is secured by 350 slabs of Cottonwood limestone. There will be continued revegetation & weed management throughout the season, but the trail is now open for use.

Alderfer/Three Sisters Park trail improvements. Forest management work has been completed; now the trails are being restored to their original condition by the JCOS Trails Team. Full access to Alderfer/Three Sisters should be happen soon.

Clear Creek Trail construction milestone. The Clear Creek Trail, formerly known as the Peaks to Plains Trail, has three new bridges, which were installed about a mile west of Tunnel 1. These bridges were installed during the day, necessitating only short traffic holds on Highway 6, unlike other bridges, which necessitated a full closure of the highway. The new bridges have the same bowstring truss designation as the existing bridges, with "out lookers" in the middle of the spans, and all are vehicular rated.

Pine Valley Ranch, Narrow Gauge Climbing Crag. Work is progressing on the Narrow Gauge Slabs. Thirty-three steps have been built into the largest rock staircase, a few more need to be installed. Additionally, a large rock retaining wall on the easternmost end of the route will be built. Weather permitting, this project should be completed by the end of August.

Fire Preparedness Training: Open Space Wildland Fire Team (OSWFT) was one of several agencies assisting Eagle Valley Wildland on a prescribed burn in the town of Eagle, CO for three days in April that burned over 100 acres. Additionally, OSWFT members attended a multi-agency wildfire training at Genesee Mountain Park. Hosted by Foothills Fire, there were 13 agencies in attendance and over 80 firefighters. The training focused on important skills like structure triage, pump/water operations, digging/creating fire breaks, air operations, and fire lookout.

Together Jeffco is a two-year process which combines efforts to update the Comprehensive Plan (CP), Transportation and Mobility Plan (TMP), Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP), Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan Evacuation Annex (CEMP EA), and development regulations to create a Unified Land Use Code (ULUC).

Here's what has happened or is happening now:

Another meeting was held with our Stakeholders to present draft goals for the Comprehensive Plan (CP) and Transportation & Mobility Plan (TMP), revised land use maps for the CP, draft strategies for the Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP) and a draft Evacuation Annex (EA).

Additional staff review of goals, policies, graphics and callouts for the Comprehensive Plan are underway.

Over 400 transportation projects have been identified for prioritization. Additional goal[s] and policies are being developed for the TMP.

The draft CWPP is currently undergoing review by the CWPP-EA Advisory Committee.

The EA has been reviewed by key stakeholders and staff and will be released for broad public review at the same time as the draft CWPP.

Next in the process:

In early September look for the draft CWPP and EA to be sent out for comments during a 14-day public notification period. Any comments to those documents will be gathered and incorporated as applicable. Finalization of the EA and signatures on the CWPP signifying adoption are anticipated in early October. There are no public hearings associated with the adoption of those plans.

In mid-October, the draft CP and TMP will be presented at public outreach meetings. Please note that this is a slight delay from our previous emails. The last Questionnaire will also be sent out at that time as the meetings and drafts will be posted on the website for comments. After comments are reviewed and incorporated as applicable, the Planning Commission will hold a hearing to review the plans. We are anticipating this to occur in early December.

In regard to the regulation revisions, also known as the Unified Land Use Code (ULUC), the County has selected the law firm of Brownstein Hyatt Farber Schreck, LLP to continue with the regulation revisions.



WATCH THIS SPACE...Local Goings-on

Denver Water is in the process of transferring 45 miles of the 71-mile-long High Line Canal to Arapahoe County. The canal winds through 11 jurisdictions, from Waterton Canyon in Douglas County to northeast Aurora. The High Line Canal Conservancy, formed in 2014 to protect the canal, will hold the conservation easement for the 45 miles given to Arapahoe
